Qualifications:	Master's Degree in Art Therapy and current certification/registration as an Art Therapist (ATR or ATR-BC) preferred. Minimum 1–2 years of experience working with children and adolescents, preferably in a school or therapeutic educational setting. Strong knowledge of developmental psychology, mental health disorders, and creative therapeutic interventions. Experience working with students with emotional and behavioral disabilities (EBD/ED).

Job Goal:	The Art Therapist will provide therapeutic art interventions for K–12 students enrolled in Behavioral Health and Special Education programs. This role supports children experiencing emotional, behavioral, and mental health challenges by using creative expression to foster self-awareness, emotional regulation, social skills, and personal growth. The Art Therapist collaborates with teachers, counselors, school psychologists, and families to develop and implement individualized and trauma-informed care.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide individual and group art therapy sessions tailored to students' emotional, cognitive, and developmental levels.
- Assess students' emotional and psychological needs using art-based assessments and observation.
- Integrate trauma-informed and culturally responsive practices into therapy sessions.
- Collaborate with the Emotional Support team, special education staff, and related service providers to coordinate support services.
- Educate school staff and families on the role of art therapy and ways to support students' emotional needs through creative expression.
- Promote a safe, inclusive, and respectful therapeutic environment for all students.
- Monitor and manage therapy materials, supplies, and art spaces safely and appropriately.

Perform other duties as directed by Director or Coordinator of Behavioral Health.
